<u>Information of Selective System for Schools</u> <u>You Can Select School When You Enter Elementary School</u> <u>or Junior High School Next Spring</u>

•Selective System for Schools:-

This is a system that allows parents to send their children to public schools <u>outside their school districts</u> regardless of reasons.

Scope of schools you can choose

Those schools which are in the school districts that are adjacent to the school district of your residential place, to which school children can go on foot safely.

Who are applicable

Those who live in Matsudo city and are expected to be fresh first graders of elementary school or junior high school next spring.

How to apply

You submit "Application form for Selection of School" together with

"Announcement of Admission to a School" which is scheduled to reach you towards the end of November, to School Affairs Section (*Gakumu-ka*).

*As for information of the period for application, the list of schools you can choose and the number of children acceptable, please refer to the pamphlet to be distributed in October onward or home page of Board of Education.

* If the number of applicants exceeds the acceptable number, the winners are chosen by an open lottery.

Petition for Enrollment to Schools outside the child's school district:-If you wish your child to enroll a school outside your school district with some reasons, you can submit a petition for so doing.

Examples of reasons for petition

* (2) and (3) are applicable to children entering elementary school only.

1 You have a fixed plan to move to the place outside your present school district.

- 2 Parents have to leave their children with their relatives or others because of their job.
- ③ Because parents are out of home daytime, they have to let their child go back to the parents' work place.
- ④ Because parents are sick, it is difficult for a child to go to a school in the designated school district.
- ⑤ Parents wish to let their child go to the same school the child's brother or sister goes to.

Documents required

A statement of reasons, personal seal (*inkan*), Announcement of Admission to a School (if it reached you already).

Your application with the required documents will be accepted at School Affairs Section (*Gakumu-ka*) (Tel 366-7457) from early October.

- *No application is required, if your child is going to enter a school in the school district of your residential place.
- *If your child is going to be a fresh first grader of school in Matsudo city transferring from a school outside Matsudo city, please contact School Affairs Section (Gakumu-ka).

<u>Tojo Historical Museum - - - Special Exhibition - - -</u> <u>Shougun and Prince "the Loser's" Meiji Restoration</u>
